"The Integralist flag was formed by the Greek letter sigma, meaning the "sum of all Brazilians". The symbol was also used in armbands worn by their followers during their marches."

"That inspiration could be seen, for instance, on their green shirts, the national version of the Fascism's black shirts and the brown shirts worn by Nazis - they were nicknamed green chickens by their opponents."

"points of similarity between Brazilian Integralism and Europe's totalitarian movements: the creation of an internal enemy."
